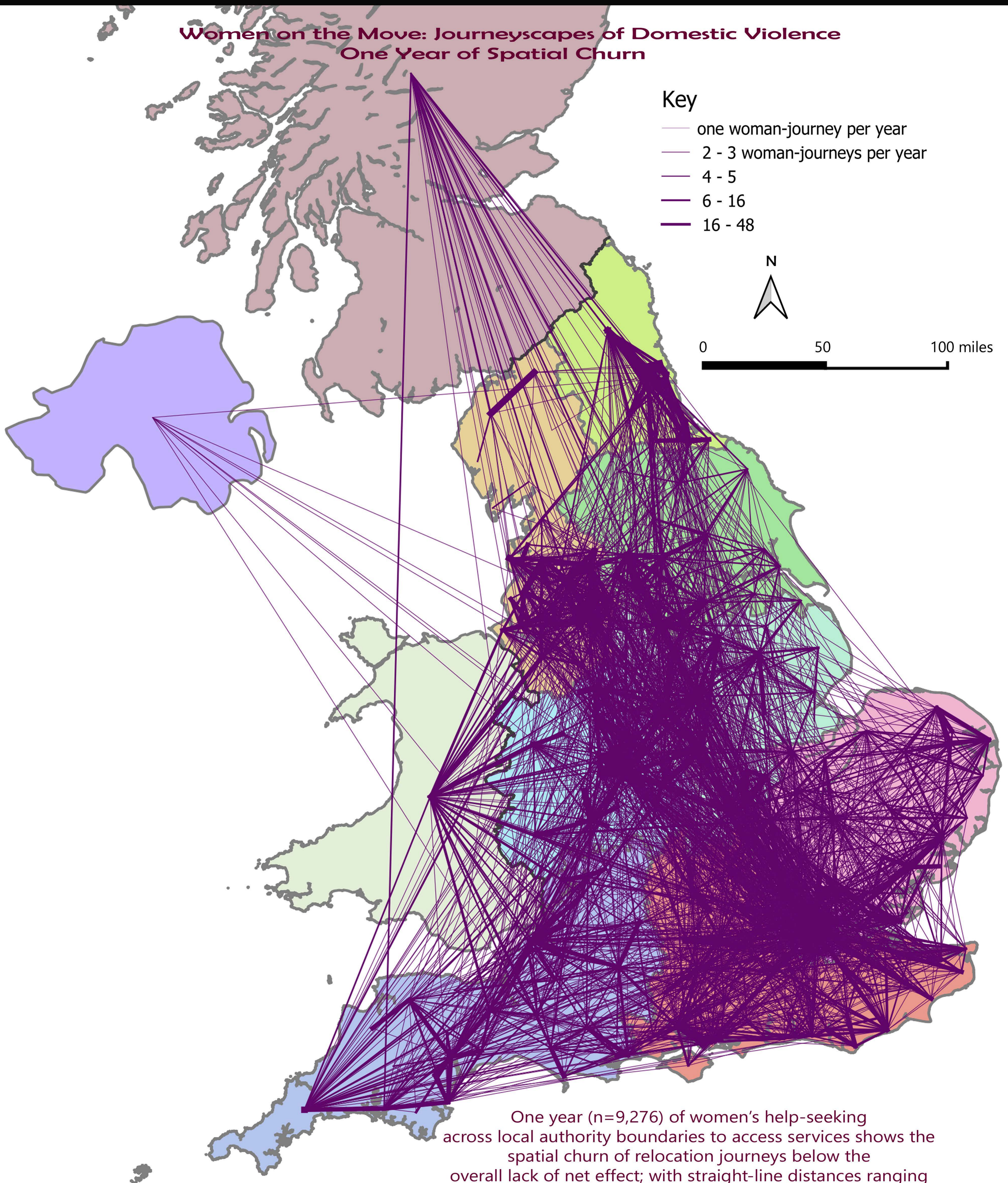


Women on the Move: Journeyscapes of Domestic Violence One Year of Spatial Churn



One year (n=9,276) of women's help-seeking across local authority boundaries to access services shows the spatial churn of relocation journeys below the overall lack of net effect; with straight-line distances ranging from just over a mile to 450+ miles.
